Good Behaviour at school is always an issue for some children who struggle with the challenges of working with others.... and we aim to have that move onto **Great Behaviour**.

At Clive School we continually work on the concept of 'care and support' or 'manaakitanga' with all students and staff.

It is amazing to see just how far children are able to care for and of others, in a positive way. A focus on positive words encouraging words and empowering words will assist in your child developing great behaviour.

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If they already have it, then it reinforces what they do as being correct.

Teachers, like you as parents know that in order to learn, children need to have a positive attitude and behaviour skill set.

Teachers also know that children's engagement in learning comes from their providing interesting, age appropriate and challenging learning opportunities.

At home as Parents and Whanau, being able to ask of your child 'what happened to day' at school, helps build that positive trust relationship between home and school.

Focus on what went well for them and what new thing they learnt. Ask the question of them how did they help someone else to learn. It also allows you to link it to what you do at home with the classroom .

It really adds that real life learning point beyond the classroom. Yes it is a part of being a CLIVE KID and a top citizen of tomorrow.

This term our **'theme' or Kaupapa** for this term is based on creative performance. Students developing a 'school play' as part of our performing Arts programme.

They are a social nuisance long warm hair is nice for them the cleaner the better. *A rinse of soda water one week after washing and the following week acetic acidic acid (lemon juice type) changes the hairs pH and nits don't like that . My name is Steve Webb, I have been playing music for 30+ years. I have been in numerous bands including, Soda Speak, Switch, Spider Blue, Old Bones and Streightup. The band Streightup (www.streightup.kiwi.nz) is a covers band that I formed five years ago and plays around the local music scene such as The Common Room, Side Line Bar, Jarks City Side, The Paisley Stage and then a range of private functions. My role in this band is lead singer and lead guitarist. I also compose and produce music to a music library that services Radio and TV New Zealand.

I am offering the students of Clive school some continuity in their music offering around Guitar, with options around Ukulele and Bass.

This would take place on a Wednesday morning as before. Firstly I would like to have some contact with interested parents around lesson content and costs.
